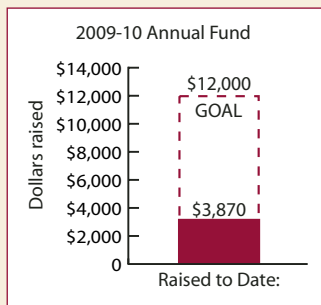

Back Where He Belongs

Lt. Commander Harold R. M. Gilmore (Phi Phi '24) Portrait Returns to Greet Alumni and Undergraduates

After its un-ceremonial removal by another fraternity a few years ago, the distinguished portrait of **Lt. Harold R. M. Gilmore (Phi Phi '24)** was recovered, restored and unveiled at this year's Homecoming celebration. His portrait is once again displayed in honor above the mantle in the Gilmore Library at 3809 Locust Walk. Before Brother Gilmore's untimely death in 1943, while serving in the U.S. Navy, he acquired a \$5,000 life insurance policy with the Sigma Chi Foundation as its beneficiary. His leadership and devotion to Sigma Chi, joined by many others over the years, has created an \$11M fund in Evanston. From the Phi Phi Chapter's account within this educational fund, the Phi Phi House Corp. awarded two actives with the inaugural "Gilmore Scholarships." In acknowledgement of their most improved GPA status, undergraduate brothers **Jonathan Green '11** and **Kenneth Csaplar '11** were each awarded \$500 toward their academic pursuits at Penn along with copies of a book authored by **Jon M. Huntsman '59**, *Winners Never Cheat: Even in Difficult Times*. These awards were presented by the brothers' fellow under-graduate scholarship chairman, **Tom Cassel '10**, on behalf of the House Corporation.

Awarding Outstanding Phi Phi Alumni

Additional award presentations were also made to other alumni, as the chapter celebrated its continued International Fraternity leadership in numerous categories. With about 50 brothers and family members on hand, all retreated to the well-appointed Phi Phi Chapter Room for the occasion. In the shadow of our framed 1875 charter, **Jacques Gordon '78** was presented with the Significant Sig award by fellow Sig Sig, **Raymond Welsh '53**. 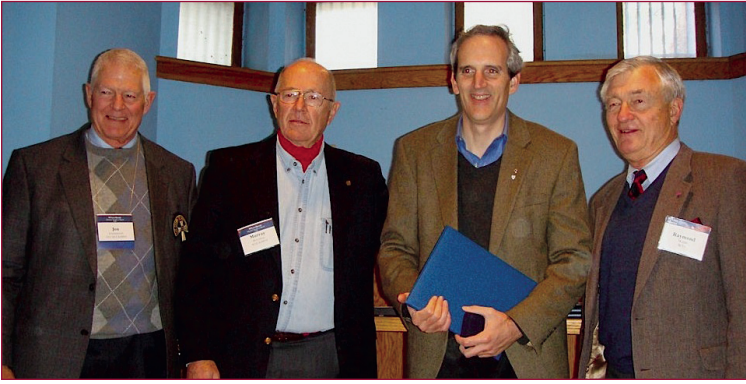
The distinguished portrait of Lt. Harold R. M. Gilmore '24 is back where it belongs: in the Gilmore Library at 3809 Locust Walk.

Induction into the Order of Constantine is bestowed by the International Fraternity to those brothers who exhibit a sustained commitment to service on behalf of Sigma Chi. **Mark Kocent '82** received this award as part of the class of 2008 Constantine Sigs. He becomes the eighth Phi Phi to receive the Fraternity's highest honor award and was joined by fellow past awardees **Jon Greenawalt Sr. '61** and **Murray McComas '58**.

The Phi Phi Chapter House Corporation, officially titled The Sigma Chi Club of Philadelphia, Inc., has the privilege of awarding the Phi Phi Chapter Award at the discretion of its Board of Trustees. In our chapter's 134-year history, this award has been given five times, most recently to **Murray McComas '58** in 1999. This year, the Trustees chose to honor **Jon Greenawalt Sr. '60** "in recognition and appreciation of his unselfish, sustained loyalty, devotion and service to the Phi Phi Chapter" as evidenced by his recently completed, eighth annual Leadership Development Program, managed for the undergraduate chapter leaders.

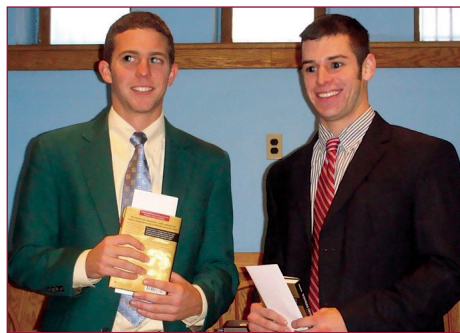
